



ANGKOR WAT

This primary research is the front wall to the Angkor Wat entry which was built almost thousand years ago which are still durable until now because of the structure of the stone which are lined up in blocks, each block support each other and create the top of beautiful architecture. Khmer people in those days had strong belief in magic, sorcery, witchcraft and prophecy, as a way to protect themselves from their enemies, they cast the most powerful spell and buried the "Ar-tan" (the protector) along the gateway to Angkor Wat. It believes anyone possesses magical power, once walked pass the gateway will lose all their power.








Marbling on fabric

Absara dance is a play by woman, sewn into the tight-fitting traditional dress, whose graceful, sinuous gestured are codified to narrate classical myths or religious stories. The costumes of the apsara role is based on the devatas as depicted on bas-relief of Angkor Wat. They wear a sampot sarabap, a type of silk brocade that is intricately pleated in the front.
